A SPECIAL RESPECT LIFE HOLY HOUR

The Pro-Life Ministry invites everyone to the Respect Life Holy Hour this **Tuesday, October 25**. October is the month of the Holy Rosary and, to honor our Blessed Mother, the Scriptural Rosary – which combines the regular recitation of the Rosary with passages from scripture said before each “Hail Mary” – will be prayed. We’ll meditate on the Joyful Mysteries as prayers are offered for all life from conception to natural death. The Respect Life Holy Hour begins with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the Scriptural Rosary (with singing in both English and Spanish between every decade), a Gospel reading and benediction.

NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time
October 30, 2016

As October winds down, the Church celebrates the feasts of many canonized priests. The list includes apostles, bishops, founders, a Father of the Church, martyrs and religious-order priests. How fitting, since October 30 has been designated "Priesthood Sunday" throughout the world.

St. Ignatius of Antioch was remembered on October 17. Revered as an "Apostolic Father," Bishop Ignatius was a student of St. Polycarp, himself a disciple of St. John the Apostle. It is recorded that the elderly Bishop Polycarp kissed Ignatius' chains as the latter was en route to Rome to his martyrdom.

St. Isaac Jogues and St. John de Brébeuf (October 19) were 17th Century Jesuit missionaries who were brutally martyred in upstate New York at the hands of the Iroquois. These "North American Martyrs" enjoyed success, however, among the more peaceable Huron people, from whom came St. Kateri Tekakwitha.

St. Paul of the Cross (October 20) founded the Passionist priests and nuns in the 18th Century. His work was vehemently opposed by diabolical forces because of its tremendous impact on the salvation of souls.

St. Anthony Mary Claret (October 24) was a renowned 19th Century preacher, reformer, missionary, catechist, founder of the Claretians and confessor to Queen Isabella II. He was appointed Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba; because of his social reforms and criticism of the injustices perpetrated against the poor, however, he was banished to Paris. His European exile, though, did enable him to participate in the First Vatican Council (1869-70).

St. Simon and St. Jude (aka Thaddeus) were apostles, priests, bishops and martyrs. They reportedly traveled, preached and were executed together. Hence, their relics lie in the same tomb in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Their feast day is October 28.

Priesthood Sunday was inaugurated in 2003 by the Serrans, a worldwide organization of Catholic laity dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life. They vigorously recognize, support and defend the thousands of faithful, dedicated priests who labor tirelessly in spite of reduced numbers, increased workloads, and negative media attention which demoralizes, disparages and diminishes.

Choir music for October 30 will include works of priest-composers: WORTHY IS THE LAMB by Fr. Ricky Manalo (a Paulist); PANIS ANGELICUS by Fr. Louis Lambillotte (a Jesuit); and MASS OF THE PATRIARCHS by Fr. Michael Dominic O'Connor (a Dominican).
