RESPECT LIFE



All Oppression Shall Cease. The Christmas song O Holy Night includes the following words: "Truly He taught us to love one another/ His law is love, and His gospel is peace./ Chains shall He break, for the slave is our brother/ And in His name all oppression

shall cease." This is a reminder that, as we celebrate Christmas, we renew our commitment to ending all oppression, particularly of those who are most oppressed: the children living before birth within their mothers, children who have been deprived of legal protection and are oppressed by the mythology of choice. In the name of the newborn Christ, the oppression of our unborn children will cease. May Christmas give us the strength to be silent no more, and more active than ever in the pro-life cause.

The next Respect Life Holy Hour – which is also the National Night of Prayer for the Unborn (SEE article below) – is Wednesday, December 28 at 7:00 pm.

NATIONAL NIGHT OF PRAYER FOR THE UNBORN

December 28 marks the Feast of the Holy Innocents when, during the Octave of Christmas, we commemorate those infants slaughtered by King Herod. Fittingly, our Respect Life Holy Hour this month will remember other innocent babies who have died through miscarriage, illness and, of course, abortion. The Gospel for this Feast reminds us as well of the loss experienced by the mother: "A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children, and she would not be consoled, since they were no more." (Matthew 2:18, quoting the prophet Jeremiah) Several women will share their personal stories with us, including Regina Higgins Syversen (sister of Father Higgins); Mrs. Syversen will speak of her own experience, including the loss of a full-term baby shortly after birth. Please join us on Wednesday, December 28 from 7:00 pm through 10:00 pm for this bilingual night of prayer, including Eucharistic Adoration, music, praying of the Rosary and the Divine Mercy chaplet. Confession will also be available. Let us ask the modern-day Innocents. who have perished through abortion, to intercede for babies in the womb and for their mothers.

MARCH FOR LIFE 2017

The annual March for Life in Washington, DC takes place on **Friday**, **January 27**, **2017**. Forty-four years ago, the Supreme Court handed down its decision in Roe v. PROCESSION IN HONOR OF THE CHILD JESUS

Each year on **Christmas Day**, our Spanish community celebrates the *Pasada del Niño*, a parade-like procession beginning at 1:00 pm at the Peekskill Train Station and continuing up Central Avenue to the Church. This procession consists of "Allegorical Cars" — elaborately-decorated vehicles accompanied by family members dressed as characters in the Gospel infancy narratives. The final figure in the *Pasada* is the statue of the Child Jesus, which was donated to Assumption in 2008 by the Archbishop of Cuenca (Ecuador). A solemn Christmas Mass will follow in the Church at 2:30 pm. All are welcome to experience this festive display of faith and devotion.

"Hello, my name is Catherine Bischoff. I was born and raised in Peekskill and have been a parishioner of Assumption Church all my life.

I graduated from Assumption School, as did my mother, Jackie Salicco, and received all my sacraments here.

I have two children, Christine and John. (John currently works at Assumption Cemetery.) I also have two grandchildren, Bennie and Ziva. Both of my children went through the Religious Education program at Assumption Church, and now my grandson attends it.

I began working in the Religious Ed program here 20 years ago as a 6th Grade catechist and was asked to step in and run the entire program when the previous coordinator became ill.

I subsequently went through the six-year certification program from the Archdiocese of New York and am now a Certified Coordinator of Religious Education.

When I started with Assumption's Religious Ed program, there were 150 students, and our current enrollment is 672 students! My most rewarding and memorable moments as a CRE are when the students receive their sacraments – First Penance, First Communion, and Confirmation."

NOTES FROM THE LOFT Carols – The Music of Christmas December 2016

"Here we come a-caroling!"

Of French and Anglo-Norman medieval origins, the "carol" describes a joyous "dance song" or "circle song," originally associated with pre-Christian observations of the arrival of the seasons.

Carols fall into a variety of classifications and moods.

SPANISH CAROLS, like the 16th Century *villancico* "Ríu, Ríu, Chíu," are festive and accompanied by clapping, whereas those of eastern Europe tend to be more poignant.

NATIVITY CAROLS, the largest group, herald the birth of the Christ Child. Luther's cradle hymn "Away in a Manger," the Polish favorite "Infant Holy, Infant Lowly" and the German "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming" are prime examples. "Joy to the World" – more a hymn than a carol – takes its cue from the opening notes of "Lift Up Your Heads" from Handel's "Messiah."

PRAYER CAROLS. The Italian "Tu Scendi dalle Stelle," composed by Pope Pius IX in 1878, sings of the sacrifice of the Heavenly King who "camest down... from starry sky. Thy sacrifice, O love Divine, is all for me."

MYSTERY CAROLS with medieval roots sing of legendary events associated with the Holy Family. England's highly imaginative "The Cherry Tree Carol" has the distinction of being both a ballad and a carol. It takes its story from the apocryphal Gospel of Pseudo-Matthew. (Our Choir sings a text more faithful to Matthew 1:18-24.)

SHEPHERD CAROLS celebrate the announcement of the angels to the shepherds – e.g., "Angels We Have Heard on High," "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing" and "While Shepherds Watched Their Flocks by Night."

NOELS. The root for "noel" is the Latin "natalis" – i.e., birthday – specifically, Christ's. Hence, Christmas. "The First Noel" is indigenous to England and France.

MACARONIC CAROLS are written partly in Latin and partly in the vernacular. "The Snow Lay on the Ground" demonstrates this with its "Venite, adoremus, Dominum" conclusion.

LULLABY CAROLS draw upon the lullables of Europe. "Lully, Lullay, Thou Littel Tyne Childe," "Joseph Dearest, Joseph Mine," "O Come, Little Children" and Mozart's "Schlafe, mein Prinzchen" ("Sleep, My Prince") are illustrative of this international genre.

COMPANION CAROLS, originating mostly in Germany, Austria and the Tyrol, are exuberant and affectionate, even offering the Christ Child "apples, butter, pears of yellow cheese, nuts or plums or whatever You please"!

On Christmas Eve, our Carols services will begin at 3:30 pm (preceding the 4:00 pm Vigil Mass) and at 11:30 pm (preceding Midnight Mass).
