BAPTISMAL CLASS CHANGE

MARCH FOR LIFE 2017

The pilgrimage to Washington, DC for the annual March for Life takes place on **Friday, January 27**. Forty-four years ago, the Supreme Court handed down its decision in Roe v. Wade, legalizing abortion and leading to the deaths of 60 million babies in the USA. Please join hundreds of thousands from around the nation as we march to stop abortion. The cost is \$40 per person. NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Feasts of the Christmas Season:
Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (January 1, 2017)

While many will be making (and breaking) New Year's resolutions and suffering from self-inflicted hangovers on the first day of the year, the Christian world for centuries has observed January 1 in a variety of religious celebrations.

Veneration of Mary as the Mother of God – not merely as the mother of Jesus of Nazareth – was given official recognition in 431 AD by the Council of Ephesus, giving her the Greek title "*Theotokos*" or, in Latin, "*Dei Genetricis*" – i.e., she who "generated," "gave birth" to God. In its primary assertion of the divinity of Christ, Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Council, of necessity, declared Mary to be Mother of God.

The Feast of the Annunciation (March 25) was already being observed, encouraged especially by the Councils of Toledo (656 AD) and Constantinople (692 AD). But by the Seventh Century, celebrations of the Annunciation and the Assumption began to eclipse Mary's divine maternity.

In the 13th and 14th Centuries, the focus of medieval Rome, Spain and Gaul (France) was on the observance of the Circumcision of the Lord and the Octave of the Nativity: "*And at the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus...*" (Luke 2:21)

In 1578, January 1 officially became the feast of the Naming and Circumcision of Jesus, lasting until the 20th Century when changes were made by Pope Saint John XXIII (restoring the observance of the Octave of the Nativity) and by Blessed Pope Paul VI, who reclaimed January 1 as the current Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.

Because Christmas and its Octave both fell on a Sunday this year, the Feast of the Holy Family (also reinstated in 1969) was not observed, but music – especially the German carols – celebrate all three!

The 16th Century Leipzig mystery-play lullaby, JOSEPH DEAREST, JOSEPH MINE, derives its melody from the 14th Century carol "Resonet in laudibus."

LO, HOW A ROSE E'ER BLOOMING (#91) dates from the 15th Century.

O COME, LITTLE CHILDREN (#92) is the beloved work of Johann A. Schulz, an 18th Century accompanist, conductor and chapel master for the royalty of Germany, Poland and Denmark.

SEE AMID THE WINTER (#89) is a contemporary piece by Kevin Keil, written for a 19th Century lyric.

Come up to the loft! Sing with the Choir as we celebrate the Virgin Mother, glorious St. Joseph and the Divine Child!

EL NOMBRE de Legión de María obedece a que el espíritu de la organización quiere ser el mismo de la Virgen Santa María. Ella es la reina de los Apóstoles, porque fue la primera en presentar a Cristo ante los hombres.

¿QUIÉNES PUEDEN PERTENECER? TODO CATÓLICO que practique fielmente su religión y desee ser útil a la Iglesia y a la sociedad, y que esté dispuesto a cumplir las normas funcionales de la asociación.

¿QUÉ HACE? Orar y trabajar apostólicamente. Funciona con reuniones semanales de grupo, donde se ora, se revisa la actividad apostólica, y se estudian temas formativos para hacer más eficaz el apostolado.

SU SISTEMA es sencillo. Cada legionario activo debe:

1. Asistir puntual y semanalmente a la junta de su grupo, donde se mezclan íntimamente la revisión del trabajo efectuado, la formación espiritual y humano-apostólica, con la oración en común.
2. Rezar diariamente la Catena, que es el Magníficat de la Virgen, la oración de los pobres y de los humildes.
3. Realizar un trabajo apostólico concreto cada semana, con duración mínima de dos horas, acompañado de otro legionario.
4. Mantener en secreto los asuntos discutidos en la Junta o conocidos en el ejercicio del trabajo legionario."
