NOTES FROM THE LOFT

A Brief History of the Church Organ – Part I

“What’s so great about the ORGAN?” The question was posed in a fairly recent article, ‘Frequently Asked Questions on Sacred Music’ circulated by the Church Music Association of America. It was answered thus: “Since gaining acceptance for liturgical use in the Middle Ages, the organ has been esteemed for its contribution to sacred music. Its method of producing sound recalls the human voice itself, which the Church has given primacy in her worship. Its use over the centuries in a solo and supportive role has given the organ a unique status above all other instruments.”

The response is in accord with the recognition of this magnificent instrument given in the major Vatican II document “The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy” (SC) (Dec. 4, 1963) and the directive “Instruction on Music in the Liturgy” (MS) (Sacred Congregation of Rites, Mar. 5, 1967): “The PIPE ORGAN is to be held in high esteem in the Latin Church*, for it is the traditional musical instrument, the sound of which can add a wonderful splendor to the Church’s ceremonies and powerfully lifts up men’s minds to God and higher things.” (SC #120) (MS # 62) * Roman Catholic Church

During his 2006 visit to Regensburg, Germany, Pope Benedict XVI (himself a musician) blessed the new organ at the Alte Kapelle (High Chapel), saying, “The organ has always been considered, and rightly so, the king of musical instruments, because it takes up all the sounds of creation...and gives resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation. By transcending the merely human sphere, as all music of quality does, it evokes the divine. The organ’s great range of timbre, from ‘piano’ (soft) through to a thundering ‘fortissimo’, makes it an instrument superior to all others. It is capable of echoing and expressing all the experiences of human life. The manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God.”

PIPE organs have also found a home in synagogues, concert halls and stadiums, boasting a repertoire spanning over 500 years!

A Tragic Commemoration On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court, in the Roe vs. Wade decision, made its worst mistake in history. By declaring that children in the womb are not “persons,” it opened the door to tens of millions of abortions. The website of the Alan Guttmacher Institute (formerly the research arm of Planned Parenthood, which is the single largest source of abortions in America), states, “From 1973 through 2011, nearly 53 million legal abortions occurred.” It also points out that “Twenty-one percent of all pregnancies (excluding miscarriages) end in abortion,” and that abortions at 21 weeks of pregnancy or later number somewhere around 12,720 per year in America. In 2011, there were 1.06 million abortions in our country. Indeed, as we mark another Roe vs. Wade commemoration, it is time for all of us to get involved in the efforts to end abortion. HOW THE BELLS WILL TOLL

Assumption is delighted to have her bell ringing again. The bell will ring at the following moments:

- For the recitation of the **Angelus** at 6:00am, 12 Noon, and 6:00pm
- An hourly **chime** from 7:00am-9:00 pm
- 15 minutes before each Sunday Mass
- Funeral Toll: as the casket of the beloved deceased person enters and leaves the church, the bell will toll (single ringing at 8 to 10 second interval).
- Wedding Peal: As the newly married couple exits the Church our church bell will peal (the joyful sound of a swinging bell).

ASH WEDNESDAY PREPARATIONS

According to the liturgical norms of the Church, the Ashes imposed on Ash Wednesday are to be made from burning the blessed palms from Palm Sunday of the previous year. To prepare for Ash Wednesday, we ask parishioners to please bring your palms from last year and place them in the receptacle provided in the back of the Church the weekend of February 1st, 2015, next weekend.
