NOTES FROM THE LOFT

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time The MISSA SIMPLEX

Since the return to Ordinary Time, the Choir has been singing a new, English chant Mass, the MISSA SIMPLEX or "Simple Mass". This contemporary Mass setting is the combined effort of two liturgical musicians: Dominican Fr. Michael O'Connor and the late Richard Proulx (1937-2010). The story is that Fr. O'Connor found Proulx's newest "Gloria" so lovely that he was inspired to create the other 'Ordinary' parts to go with it.

Richard Proulx began his musical training with piano lessons at age six. As a first grader at St. Patrick's Parochial School, St. Paul, MN, his day included TWO music classes with an emphasis on choral singing! His boyhood education would take him to the American Boychoir School at Princeton, NJ, St. John's (Benedictine) Abbey at Collegeville, MN and the Royal School of Church Music, England. A cathedral organist, hand bell choir master, conductor of chamber orchestras and numerous choirs, composer, educator and lecturer, Proulx's talent and drive earned him both national and international renown. His compositions, which number over three hundred, can be found in Catholic, Methodist, Mennonite, Presbyterian and Episcopal hymnals. He even found time to serve as organist for the Temple de Hirsch Sinai! Eventually, he would become the music director/organist for Chicago's Cathedral of the Holy Name. Proulx's ensemble, "The Cathedral Singers", founded in 1991, has produced over twenty-five CDs. His music has been featured in secular movies and television.

In 1998 St. John's Abbey honored Proulx with its prestigious "Pax Christi" award, "given to those who have devoted themselves to God by working in the tradition of Benedictine monasticism to serve others and to build a heritage of faith in the world." Posthumously, the Alcuin Library on its campus became the recipient of his manuscripts, correspondence and reference collection.

Fr. O'Connor, who developed the Mass setting, is currently on the faculty of Providence College, RI, adjunct professor of sacramental, liturgical and spiritual theology. He modestly lists music as his 'hobby'! Assumption Choir and congregation are familiar with his beautiful MASS OF THE PATRIARCHS. His SIENA CHANT MASS was composed for St. Catherine of Siena Parish, NYC.

RESPECT LIFE



Abortion Survivors Child psychiatrist Philip Ney relates, "A woman reported telling her nine year old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said, 'I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?'" (Abortion Survivors, p.36). This is a story repeated more times than most people realize, and representing a societal and pastoral problem whose proportions are greater today than at any previous time in history: the phenomenon of tens of millions of abortion survivors. It is clear that abortion's primary victim is the child who is killed. It has also become increasingly clear that to kill the child is to harm the mother and father as well. What is not always so well known, however, is that abortion makes its impact felt on those who have had a sibling aborted, and that this impact is felt in surprising and astonishing ways, which also have wider implications for the whole of society. **The next Respect Life Holy Hour will be on Tuesday, February 24, 2015 at 7:00 PM**

RULES FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT



Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting as explained by the U.S. Bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal. Abstinance forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

ASH WEDNESDAY PREPARATIONS

According to the liturgical norms of the Church, the Ashes imposed on Ash Wednesday are to be made from burning the blessed palms from Palm Sunday of the previous year. Come to watch your palms burn after the 9am Mass on Saturday, February 14, 2015. We will meet in the parking lot; weather permitting.
