NOTES FROM THE LOFT 2nd Sunday of Lent

Today's Gospel Reading from the first chapter of St. Mark alludes very briefly to Jesus' forty days of prayer and fasting in the desert. (The accounts of Matthew and Luke give details of His 'testing' or temptation.) Mark 2-8 narrates a whirlwind of cures and castings-out of demons as Jesus' Messianic mission explodes on the scene.

Next Sunday's Gospel brings us right to the event of the Transfiguration. Jesus reveals His divinity to key apostles, Peter, James and John, because the faith of the Twelve is going to be severely 'tested' by the Passion. The first pope will need to be strengthened by this Transfiguration experience, for he will be crucified for this Faith. James, future head of the Church in Jerusalem, will also be martyred; and John will flee with Mary to Ephesus, Turkey to escape the siege of Jerusalem and the destruction of the Temple by the Romans in 70 AD. Next week's First Reading also focuses on a great 'testing' – the command by God to Abraham to sacrifice Isaac, the child of the promise of Abraham's great posterity.

The hymn, THE GOD OF ABRAHAM PRAISE ('Yigdal Elohim Hai' in Yiddish) has very interesting origins. The work of Daniel ben Judah, a 14th century Roman Jew, judge and liturgical poet, and set to the Hebrew melody 'Leoni', it contains the 13 Articles of the Jewish Faith, as compiled by the pre-eminent 12th century Jewish rabbi, philosopher, scholar and physician, Mosheh ben Maimon, known by his Latin name: Maimonides. The 'Yigdal' (which means 'magnify') was sung as part of morning and evening prayer. Interestingly, Christian "Evening Prayer" or "Vespers" includes Mary's 'Magnificat', a hymn of praise.

The 13 Articles bear a striking resemblance to our Creed, showing the direct connection between the two Faiths rooted in the same Divine Revelation: the belief in one God, the all-knowing, unchanging, and eternal Creator. Spirit in nature and separate from His creation, He provides for it. He is the source of immutable Truth and spoke through the prophets. He knows the hearts and deeds of men, who will be rewarded or punished accordingly and who will rise from the dead.

The Choir will sing THE GOD OF ABRAHAM PRAISE at next Sunday's 10:00 Mass during the Presentation of Gifts.
