NOTES FROM THE LOFT

The Music of MERCY!

HIS MERCY IS FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION reads the inscrip-tion above Assumption's altar. In his encyclical, "Dives in Misericordia" (Rich in Mercy 1980) the Pope of Mercy, St. John Paul II, called mercy "Love's second name," because mercy flows from love, is an extension of love, reaching out to one who is in misery and need. He echoes the teachings of Sts. Augustine and Thomas Aguinas that mercy is the "greatest attribute" of God because it is the motive behind what He does in His infinite wisdom, goodness and power. St. Faustina simply writes. "Love is the flower; mercy the fruit." (948)

The Scriptures use three words which are rendered in English as 'mercy'. The Old Testament uses the Hebrew word 'HESED', which translates as "covenant love", i.e. steadfast, reliable love which never disappoints. 'Hesedyesua' is 'saving love'. In it we see the roots of the name of Jesus, Yeshuah - Savior. The second Hebrew word is 'RACHAMIM', which derives from, 'rechim', i.e. womb. This is the tender, responsive love that springs from compassion. St. John Paul II perceived 'hesed' as the masculine love characteristic of a father and 'rachamim' as the feminine love of a mother.

The New Testament gives the third expression for mercy - 'ELEOS' - from the Greek word for an 'oil' which is poured out. Blood and water poured out from the pierced Heart of Christ – so vividly depicted in the image of the Divine Mercy, blood symbolizing the Eucharist and water, Baptism. The early Church quickly incorporated the term into the Liturgy: 'Kyrie, ELEison!' Lord, have MERCY! Translated from the Greek into Latin, we know it as 'misericordia', heartfelt pain for the misery of another, and we find it in Christian prayer and worship as 'miserere nobis', 'have mercy on us'.

The Responsorial Psalm for Mercy Sunday proclaims, "His mercy endures forever." The Gospel gives the account of the institution of the great sacrament of healing, mercy, and even restoration to the life of grace - Penance-"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them."

Choir music will include THE DAY OF RESURRECTION # 170 which sings, "His love is everlasting, His mercy endures forever," lyrics based on an 8th century text by St. John Damascene.
