NOTES FROM THE LOFT 5th Sunday of Easter

"I am the Vine, you are the branches. Whoever REMAINS in Me and I in him will bear much fruit."
 REMAIN. The word appears fourteen times in the Scriptural texts for this Sunday's Mass. "Remain in Me as I remain in you." "Remain...on the vine." It's worth an examination of the origins and definitions of this word, 'remain', this word of Jesus' choosing.
 REMAIN. From the Greek "menein". From the Latin "remanere". From the Anglo-French of the 14th century: "remaindre". Since classical times, it has meant "to stay", to "stay in the same place or with the same person." "To abide". From these we get the words "abode", "mansion" and even, "manor", places where persons dwell, live, and work. But there's more!
 REMAIN: "to be a part not destroyed". Jesus intends us to get this meaning, too. "Anyone who does not remain with Me will be thrown out...wither...thrown into a fire...and burned."
 REMAIN: "continue to be"; "continue unchanged". "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in Me." "Without Me you can do nothing."
 REMAIN: something still "left to be done" "If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done! Bear much fruit...become my disciples." This is more than a temporary, static request - like 'stay with Me'. It is an invitation to a new life - not only with Him but IN Him- a dynamic exchange of energy, of mission and unity among persons - Him and us!
 Choir music will include selections which sing of the VINE and of REMAINING. The oldest is an anonymous piece entitled MARY THE DAWN which juxtaposes Mother and Son with the lines, "Mary the root; Christ the Mystic Vine. Mary the grape; Christ the Sacred Wine." The minor key of I AM THE LIVING BREAD (Srs.Martin and Theophane, OSF) praises Christ, "the Mystic Vine, embracing all creation." NOW WE REMAIN # 514 is by David Haas, recording artist, prolific composer, choir director and cantor in St. Paul, MN.
