**NOTES FROM THE LOFT
TRINITY SUNDAY**

MAY 31, 2015

“The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the CENTRAL mystery of the Christian Faith and life.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church #233). To clearly define our Christology and our Trinitarian Faith in the face of the Arian heresy, the first two ecumenical councils of the Church, Nicea 325 AD and Constantinople 381 AD, produced the expanded Creed still prayed at Mass today. We are baptized “in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” (CCC # 234) The ‘Doxology’ is a Trinitarian expression of praise: “Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.” Every time we reverently and thoughtfully bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, we make a personal act of faith in the Trinity.

In an article for Catholic Online (2010) Deacon Keith Fournier elaborates on the connection between, faith, worship and life. “ Liturgical worship is not an ‘add on’ for a Catholic Christian. It is the foundation of Catholic identity, expressing our highest purpose. Worship reveals what we truly believe...” He continues, “ There is a Latin maxim that addresses the centrality of worship in the life, identity and mission of the Catholic Church: ‘Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi’: the law of prayer is the law of belief. It is sometimes expanded to ‘lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi’. Translation: how we WORSHIP expresses what we BELIEVE and determines how we LIVE.

Hymn # 212 HOLY, HOLY, HOLY is set to the tune “Nicea”. The lyrics by Reginald Heber (1783-1826) were composed for Trinity Sunday. The 19th century tune by John B. Dykes is a tribute to the Council of Nicea.

ETERNAL FATHER, STRONG TO SAVE # 638 was written in 1860 by shipwreck survivor William Whiting during his tenure as Headmaster of the Winchester College Choristers’ School. It was adopted not only by the Royal and US Navies (1879), but by other armed services. The tune, ‘Melita’, also by Dykes, is an ancient term for the British island colony of Malta, where St. Paul suffered shipwreck (Acts of the Apostles: 26-27). Choir music will include these selections on Trinity Sunday.

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW



As part of long range planning in the process of *Making All Things New*, Cardinal Dolan established twelve ministry directives for each cluster within the Archdiocese to be prioritized and implemented. We belong to Cluster 51 which includes, Assumption in Peekskill, Holy Name of Mary in Croton-on-Hudson, Holy Spirit in Cortlandt Manor, Saint Columbanus in Cortlandt Manor, Saint Christopher's in Buchanan which will merge with Saint Patrick's in Verplanck. The cluster representing these parishes have identified four priorities to be implemented in the next year.

- Plan and implement a common, cluster-wide evangelization program.
- Evaluate and develop strategies for enhancing lifelong faith formation for adults.
- Evaluate the need for a Sunday morning Spanish Mass within the Cluster
- Create or enrich collaborative youth and young adult ministry.

Other directives will be emphasized in subsequent years.

On Sunday, June 7 at 2:30pm, there will be a Solemn Mass in celebration of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi).
