NOTES FROM THE LOFT Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time
June 21, 2015

Next Sunday's Readings draw our attention to the power of "God the Father ALMIGHTY, CREATOR of Heaven and earth." The Book of Job reminds us that He is the Lord of the storm. He sets the boundaries of the sea. Responsorial Ps.107 sings of the anxious sailors' prayer, eliciting rescue, praise and thanksgiving. With Psalm 8 probably in their minds, Mark's Gospel records the consternation of the Apostles at Jesus' powerful – and effective - command to the winds and the water, "BE STILL !"

HOW GREAT THOU ART (# 423) has an interesting history. Story goes that Carl Gustave Boberg (1859-1940) enroute home after church, witnessed a violent thunder storm, eventually subsiding to gentle showers and a rainbow. Inspired by Psalm 8 and the mirror-like calm of Monstera Bay, the song of birds, and distant church bell, he composed a nine-verse poem which was later set to a Swedish folk melody.

Translated into German and Russian, it came to the attention of British Methodist missionary Stuart Wesley Keene Hine (1899-1989). While ministering in the Carpathian Mountains in Ukraine, he and his wife came upon a Christian couple holding a Bible service in their home. The mournful lament of their listeners to St. John's account of the crucifixion could be heard outside the house! Unwilling to disrupt the obvious work of the Holy Spirit, Stuart recorded their sentiments, composing verse 3.

The 1932 Famine Genocide in Ukraine, perpetrated by Stalin, and the outbreak of WW II in 1939, forced the missionaries to return to England. Ministering to displaced Poles and Russians, Hine was inspired to write v.4 after listening to the prayer of a Christian convert, separated from his wife, but trusting he would see her in the next life.

Recording artist, Sam Santiago is a Filipino teen from California who began singing at age two! His grade school aspiration: "I want to be a rock star, and a PASTOR!" His first semi-public performance at age eight was at a government-run facility in the Philippines for abused children. Aspiring to "entertain, inspire, uplift and minister to the world", this boy's moving version of HOW GREAT THOU ART can be found on YouTube!
