Confession will also be available. Let us ask the modern-day Innocents, who have perished through abortion, to intercede for babies in the womb and for their mothers.

NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Feasts of the Christmas Season December 2016

The Infancy Narratives are those sections of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke which provide us with the barest, yet most essential, details of the childhood of Jesus.

Matthew sets the stage by giving us a genealogy, the family tree on Saint Joseph's side. Joseph was of the House of David, from whom the Messiah would descend. So also was Mary.

Luke introduces God's messenger, the archangel Gabriel. Luke's Gospel records the fantastic events surrounding Gabriel's announcement of the conception of John the Baptist, son of Zechariah and his wife, Elizabeth (Mary's barren cousin).

Six months into this story, Gabriel then pays Mary a visit, presenting God's plan for her divine motherhood.

Mary's *fiat* (yes) is confirmed during her visit to Elizabeth. As Gabriel had said, she who is beyond her childbearing years is with child, and the Holy Spirit has revealed to Elizabeth the secret of Mary's pregnancy.

Matthew, meanwhile, records Joseph's struggles when he learns of Mary's (humanly) unexplainable pregnancy. Still on mission, Gabriel comes to Joseph in a dream: Mary's Child is of divine origin. The Savior!

Luke provides details regarding the census, the journey to Bethlehem (the "city of David"), the birth of Jesus, and the angelic announcements to the shepherds. After eight days, Jesus is circumcised; after forty days, He will be presented in the Temple.

Matthew gives the account of the Star and the Magi, who unwittingly provoke King Herod's jealousy and wrath with their queries about the birth of the "king of the Jews." After offering the Christ Child their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, they return to their homelands without reporting to Herod, having been "warned in a dream."

Joseph, too, receives an angelic visitation (Gabriel?) in a dream, urging him to flee with his family in the night, as Herod has plans to assassinate the Child.

THE COVENTRY CAROL is a 16th Century composition, the poignant lullaby of the mothers of the doomed children, the Holy Innocents. It is one of three songs in one of the Coventry mystery plays – "Pageant of the Shearmen and Tailors." Its second verse tells the story of the slaughter of these innocents.

Music of the Christmas season, honoring the Divine Child and His Mother Mary, will be the backdrop on Wednesday evening, December 28, as Assumption Church observes the National Night of Prayer for the Unborn.
