NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time August 21, 2016

"I come to gather nations... the distant coastlands that have never heard of my fame... [to] bring ALL your kin from ALL the nations as an offering... to Jerusalem, my holy mountain... Some of these I will take as priests and Levites, says the Lord." (Isaiah 66:18-21) So says Isaiah in the First Reading for the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time.

We respond with the words of Psalm 117: "Praise the Lord, ALL you nations... ALL you peoples!"

"Go out to ALL the world and tell the Good News" – the Gospel of our redemption!

The prophecy spoken by Isaiah (quoted above) seems to anticipate by several hundred years the answer to the question put to Jesus in the Gospel for August 21: "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" (Luke 13:23)

Jesus's response echoes Isaiah, for as Lord, He is the author of the prophecy! "And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God." (Luke 13:29)

"No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6) Salvation – even priesthood – comes not through heredity or right, familiarity or merit. It is a grace, a free gift from the Lord, won by Him on the Cross and extended to ALL who accept it.

Choir will sing several pieces of music originating in the ecumenical Taizé community. Taizé is a small French town north of Cluny which, in 1940, was near the demarcation line separating Vichy France from German-occupied territory. Inspired by his native country's position of neutrality, 25-year-old Roger Schutz, a Swiss Protestant who came to be known as Brother Roger, settled in Taizé and created a refugee site for Jews.

Despite invasion and exile, Brother Roger returned in 1944 to establish, over the next 65 years, a vibrant ecumenical community. His assassination in 2010 by a deranged person drew 10,000 people to his funeral and condolences from (then) Pope Benedict XVI.

The music of Taizé (pronounced *teh-ZAY*) has a distinctive sound: the harmonies are pleasant and tight, the melodies often repetitive and easy-to-learn. Sometimes there is a descant soaring above the melody.

The Taizé community describes its songs as "music of peace and unity." Once they are sung, you will hear them echoing in your heart – and head – all day long!

Choir pieces will include LAUDATE DOMINUM (Praise the Lord); LAUDATE OMNES GENTES! (Praise the Lord all you Peoples); MAGNIFICAT (Mary's song of praise); BLESS THE LORD; and JESUS, REMEMBER ME.

On Conscience. Pope Benedict XVI in his address to the Pontifical Academy for Life in February 2007: "The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us, 'Conscience is a judgment of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a

concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing or has already completed. In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right.' (n. 1778) From this definition it emerges that the moral conscience, to be able to judge human conduct rightly, above all must be based on the solid foundation of truth – that is, it must be enlightened to know the true value of actions and the solid criteria for evaluation. Therefore, it must be able to distinguish good from evil, even where the social environment, pluralistic culture and superimposed interests do not help it do so."
