NOTES FROM THE LOFT

October 15, 2017 Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings for next Sunday make it absolutely clear that Jesus' mission of salvation and liberation from sin, sorrow, shame and everlasting death includes EVERYONE. The inclusive vocabulary in the First Reading from Isaiah speaks of "all peoples", "all nations", "every face", and the "whole earth".

In recent weeks, the vineyard parables illustrated both the generous mercy of God toward the latecomer and the repentant, and His terrifying justice toward the proud and hard of heart: "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

Next Sunday's First Reading tells how the Lord will "provide for ALL peoples "a feast of rich food and...pure, choice wines". The Gospel taken from St. Matthew, the newly-converted collector of taxes, relates yet another excoriating encounter between Jesus and the Jewish leadership with this parable: "The kingdom of Heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son". The invited guests (God's Chosen People), however, not only "ignored the invitation" or "refused to come", but went so far as to kill the king's messengers (the prophets). In both the parable and reality, punishment was severe – over the centuries Israel was scattered, besieged, brutalized and exiled for its unfaithfulness to God. Jesus, an 'unconventional' Messiah, comes, chastising Jerusalem for its corruption, hypocrisy and self-righteousness, while inviting the "good and the bad alike" to put on the "wedding garment" of repentance and enjoy the feast!

O SACRUM CONVIVIUM (translated 'O Sacred Feast' or 'Banquet') is a 13th century prayer composed by St. Thomas Aquinas chanted during Evening Prayer on the feast of Corpus Christi. The text describes what we experience at Mass with the reception of Holy Communion:

"O sacred banquet in which Christ is received! The memory of the Passion is renewed. The mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us! Alleluia!"

Dozens of composers have created musical settings for these lyrics. They include the Englishman, Byrd (1540-1623); the Spaniard, Guerrero (1528-1599) and the Italian, Pergolesi (1710-1736) who is especially worth finding on YouTube.

Choir will sing both O SACRUM CONVIVIUM by Remondi (1850-1928) and THE SUPPER OF THE LORD by contemporary composer, Laurence Rosania next Sunday.

We are doing this also as a way of preparing for our Chapel of Perpetual Adoration, which will require that 2 parishioners are present to adore Jesus every hour of every day. EVERY MEMBER IS A MINISTER: THE GROUPS OF ASSUMPTION SERIES

*Assumption is blessed by many groups, devotions and ministries. This week we focus on the **PARISH VOCATION COMMITTEE**:*

In April 2015, the Archdiocese announced a major 4-point VOCATION PLAN: PRAY for vocations in your parish. INVITE young men to existing vocation programs and events. TEACH about the nature of vocation in Youth Ministry. CELEBRATE by calling attention to National Vocation Awareness Week and similar observances. Pastors were directed to appoint a parishioner to head up a "Parish Vocation Committee". By summer, Fr. Higgins designated me as "Vocations Promoter" for Assumption parish. In this role I serve as the liaison between Assumption and the Office of Vocations at St. Joseph Seminary, currently under the direction Fr. Chris Argano.

The nature of VOCATION is many-faceted. The Church recognizes four 'calls' or 'vocations' (L:vocare- to call). First, the UNIVERSAL call to HOLINESS which begins with Baptism: to be holy as God is holy. It is a life formed by the Commandments and nourished and purified by prayer and frequent reception of the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confession.

By God's design most members of the human family are called to the VOCATION OF MARRIAGE. For Catholics especially, Holy Matrimony gives couples the grace to sanctify each other and their children on their joint journey to Heaven. Holy marriages are the rich soil in which the seeds of "religious" vocations are often planted.

The call to CONSECRATED LIFE, as a Religious Brother, Sister, or consecrated Single person in the world, is what most of us think of as 'vocations'. These deeper, total responses to the Lord's loving call exist for the sanctification of the individual, but moreso, for service to God's People.

The call to PRIESTHOOD is the most radical, transforming dimension of the nature of 'vocation'. Through Holy Orders, a man becomes 'another Christ', given the powers to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ and to absolve God's People their sins. Without the priesthood, the Church as we know it would cease to exist. Today the Church finds itself in a "vocations crisis". The breakdown of family life, especially among Catholics, the diminished access to Catholic culture caused by the closing of Catholic schools, widespread ignorance and confusion regarding Church teaching on chastity, sexuality and marriage, the corrupt use of technology and the dramatic descent of culture into paganism make it almost impossible for the average young person to hear the voice of Jesus saying, "Come, follow Me."

Assumption Parish, however, has responded enthusiastically to Christ's invitation! Young men of high school age (13-18) regularly participate in the Archdiocese's CATHEDRAL PREP PROGRAM. Monthly Prep weekends offer spiritual growth; fraternity with seminarians and other fellows who are open to priesthood; swimming and bowling on the Seminary campus; field trips, dinners and picnics with the Cardinal; and invitations to the Ordinations. Assumption brings more participants to Prep Weekend than any other parish! Attraction to priesthood, however, begins for many by serving at the altar and by observing happy, fulfilled, dedicated priests in the home parish. Our unique "Pizza with the Padres" nights (and hopefully, this year, "Supper with the Seminarians") bring open hearts into convivial contact with the Fathers at the rectory dining table. Last summer, through the generosity of a parishioner, servers, seminarians and priests, including Fr. Chris enjoyed a sunset cruise on the Hudson. We dubbed it "Fishers of Men"!

Assumption reaches out to young ladies as well. In recent memory, we hosted a packed Vocations Night. Teens and parents dialogued with a panel of young priests and Sisters. Every summer on the Feast of the Transfiguration, carloads of young ladies travel to St. John's Basilica in Stamford, CT where members of diverse Religious communities gather to witness the Sisters of Life take their vows, celebrating afterward and touring their Villa Maria Retreat House. Our girls have visited convents, including Mt. St. Francis, to help the Sisters with special projects. Last fall, we showed a full-length film featuring St. Teresa of Calcutta. Visits to our parish by the CFRs, founded by Fr. Benedict Groeschel, and recently our pizza lunch with the Sisters of Life, and the "Life is Precious Youth Day" visit of the Sisters of the Servants of the Lord give girls the opportunity to welcome them and get their personal vocation "stories". Camp Veritas is another wonderful experience with vocation ramifications!

As Vocations Promoter, I am collaborating more closely with our Youth Ministry, Pro-Life Club, Altar Server Moderators, and the Cenacle which prays weekly for priests. In this month of the Rosary, pray the Luminous mysteries for these intentions: Fulfillment of the Universal Call to Holiness; Vocations to Marriage; To the Permanent Diaconate; To Consecrated Life; and finally, to Priesthood.
