NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time
February 12, 2017

The eyes have it! At least that's the way it looks (pun intended) when we survey the Readings for the Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time.

"The eyes of God are on those who fear Him... He is...all-seeing," says the First Reading from the Book of Sirach. The Responsorial Psalm speaks for one who desires to see, *"Open my eyes, that I may consider the wonders of your law."*

The Second Reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians instructs that God has revealed to us through His Spirit *"what eye has not seen"* – i.e., God's eternal plan for our redemption and what awaits those who are faithful.

Matthew's Gospel continues the Sermon on the Mount and compels us to sit up and listen! This unknown new Rabbi speaks with unprecedented authority and commanding technique! Jesus proceeds with a series of repetitions, *"You have heard that it was said... But I say..."* This is followed by a strong hyperbole: *"If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away."*

One sees not only with the eyes but, more so, with the mind. The Readings contain repeated references to wisdom. Sirach says, *"Immense is the wisdom of the Lord."* Paul preaches confidently about a *"wisdom [not] of this age"* – i.e., not mere human philosophy – but *"God's wisdom, mysterious [and] hidden,"* revealed to us by the God-Man, Jesus Christ.

These texts give the Choir Director abundant material to construct a well-integrated liturgy. A suitable Entrance Song would be IMMORTAL, INVISIBLE, GOD ONLY WISE (#557), which also mentions eyes! The tune, St. Denio, comes from a 19th Century Welsh hymnal, the *Canaidau y Cyssegr* (Hymns of the Sanctuary), compiled by "Wild" John Roberts, who began conducting choirs at the tender age of fourteen!

OPEN MY EYES (#390), by contemporary singer/songwriter/catechist Jesse Manibusan, connects us with the Responsorial Psalm and makes for a beautiful prayer of petition for the Presentation of Gifts at the Offertory.

The theme of Rev. Louis Lambillotte's traditional PANIS ANGELICUS (#369) is revisited in Curtis Stephan's modern and moving BREAD OF ANGELS (#367).

EYE HAS NOT SEEN (#460) by Marty Haugen draws from the Second Reading from Paul and will conclude Choir Mass on February 12 on a bright, hopeful note!

Abortion Survivors. In his book “Abortion Survivors,” child psychiatrist Dr. Philip Ney relates: “A woman reported telling her nine-year-old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said ‘I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?’” (p. 36) This is a story repeated more times than most people realize and represents a societal and pastoral problem whose proportions are greater today than at any previous time in history: the phenomenon of tens of millions of abortion survivors. It is clear abortion’s primary victim is the child who is killed. It has also become increasingly clear that to kill the child is to harm the mother and father as well. What is not always so well known, however, is that abortion makes its impact felt on those who have had a sibling aborted and that this impact is felt in surprising and astonishing ways, which also have wider implications for the whole of society.

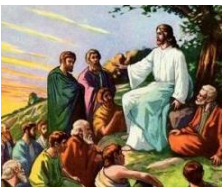

Thanks to the incredible generosity of many of our parishioners, Assumption Church is able to get started on some of our much-anticipated Renew + Rebuild projects. We were recently told by the Archdiocese that the first infusion of funds would be in April; based on that good news, we were able to contract with engineers to begin initial work on creating the St. Francis Chapel in the basement of the Rectory (where our Parish Library is currently located). Once the engineers complete their study on how best to proceed in using the space and creating another egress, work on constructing the Chapel will be put out to bid among three contractors to determine the best price. By then, the funds should be flowing through to us, and major work can begin!

BRINGING IN THE PALMS

According to liturgical norms of the Catholic Church, ashes imposed on Ash Wednesday are to be made from the burning of the blessed palms from Palm Sunday of the previous year. In preparation for Ash Wednesday – which falls on March 1 this year – please gather your palm fronds from last year and bring them with you next weekend (**February 11 and 12**) or the weekend after (**February 18 and 19**) when you come to Mass, placing them in the receptacle provided in the rear of the Church.



OUR NEW EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

Last Sunday (January 29), Assumption installed several new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC): Adriana Savo, Elliot Jorge, Valerie Short (*in absentia*), Gladys Matute and Jenny Morris. The EMHC are dedicated lay people who bring the Holy Eucharist to the homebound as well as assisting our priests and deacon in distributing Holy Communion at Mass. Thanks to our wonderful group of Eucharistic ministers, Holy Communion is brought every week to dozens and dozens of parishioners who, otherwise, would not be able to receive this incalculable grace. Congratulations to our five new members and blessings on the whole EMHC team!

SACRED RELICS OF THE SAINTS

St. Columbanus Church presents an Exposition of Sacred Relics of the Saints on **Monday, February 20** at 7:00 pm. Over 150 relics – including those of Saint Maria Goretti, Saint Thérèse of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Anthony of Padua, Saint Thomas Aquinas and Saint Faustina Kowalska – will be shown. Among the treasures presented will be a piece of a veil believed to have belonged to Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will teach about these holy objects. Those attending will be able to examine and venerate each relic and are encouraged to bring articles of devotion (rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends and family members to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession. FAMED PREACHER COMING TO ASSUMPTION



Assumption is pleased to announce that Saulo Hidalgo – renowned lay Catholic preacher and minister of healing – will be coming to our Church this coming weekend for a Healing Mass and a Pre-Lenten Retreat. Mr. Hidalgo, born in the Dominican Republic and residing in Texas, will preach at both the Healing Mass and during the day of retreat.

Friday, February 10: The evening of the Healing Mass begins at 6:30 pm with recitation of the Rosary. Father Vincent Druding will then celebrate Mass at 7:00 pm, followed by a Eucharistic Procession. Mr. Hidalgo will preach after the Procession and Benediction. A Laying-on-of-Hands service concludes the evening. (Music during the evening will be provided by the Kevin Donovan Band.)

Saturday, February 11: The Pre-Lenten Retreat will begin at 8:30 am with recitation of the Rosary and a Mass at 9:00 am; a light breakfast will be served, followed by a day of talks by Mr. Hidalgo. Agnus Dei Ministries will provide Praise and Worship music throughout the day, which will also include a Holy Hour, discussion and a break for lunch. The cost of the Retreat is \$10 per person and is open to all those age 15 and above.
