NOTES FROM THE LOFT Good Shepherd Sunday May 7, 2017

Have you noticed that the Catholic Faith is often paradoxical? Seemingly contradictory in its statements, yet true? We believe in <u>one</u> God who is <u>three</u> Persons. We profess that Jesus Christ is truly <u>God</u> – and yet truly <u>man</u>. We honor Mary as both Blessed <u>Mother</u> and ever-<u>Virgin</u>.

Jesus frequently speaks in paradoxes, many of which can be found in Matthew's Gospel. "(W)hoever would save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."(16:25) "Many that are first will be last, and the last first." (19:30) "He who is greatest among you shall be your servant." (23:12)

Next Sunday is "Good Shepherd Sunday", so named because the Gospel is taken from the tenth chapter of John in which Jesus identifies Himself as the "good" SHEPHERD. We have to pay attention to the word 'good' because in ancient times, shepherds were not generally reputable characters, so much so that they could not give testimony in court!

Jesus' sheep know His voice. He leads and they follow. Jesus also calls Himself the "gate for the sheep", the only entry into the sheepfold. Jesus brings the only really true, "good news" and offers the only acceptable sacrifice in His Blood which leads to eternal life.

Yet, here is another paradox. Jesus is also LAMB. He is called such 28 times in the Book of Revelation and 4 times in other New Testament texts. John the Baptist is the first to acclaim Him as such, "Behold the LAMB of God..." (Jn 1:29,36). Here is a further paradox: Jesus is both "great high priest" (Heb.4:14) and victim: "a sheep led to the slaughter...a lamb before its shearers". (Acts 8:32 cf Is. 53:7-8).

The music of Easter celebrates these paradoxes. AT THE LAMB'S HIGH FEAST #163 sings of Jesus as priest and paschal victim. CHRIST, THE LORD, IS RISEN AGAIN # 166 contains three references to Him as Lamb. CHRIST, THE LORD, IS RISEN TODAY # 178 contains the beautiful line, "For the sheep, the Lamb has bled." BEHOLD, THE LAMB # 150 by Bob Dufford is based the passages cited above from John and Isaiah. These pieces will be sung at the Choir Mass on Good Shepherd Sunday.

CAN I RECEIVE COMMUNION TWICE IN ONE DAY?

One of the most common questions that is asked by parishioners to their priests is: Am I allowed to receive Holy Communion twice in one day? According to a decision rendered from the 1983 Code of Canon Law; Catholics may receive Holy Communion a second time on any given



day (All the other criteria being taken for granted: e.g., fasting for 60 minutes and being in a state of grace.) - provided that the second time one receives the Eucharist, it is done in the context of a complete Mass. Therefore, if I attended Mass earlier in the day and then attended a complete second Mass, I can receive Holy Communion at that Mass. However, if I am, say, visiting a sick friend and an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion brings Holy Communion to that sick friend, I would not be able to receive Holy Communion on that occasion because it is not a complete Mass.

Hello! I'm Mario Tacca, Organist here at Assumption Church.

I was born in the Abruzzi region of Italy, and at an early age moved to France with my family, where I lived for twelve years. It was there that my God given gift of music surfaced. My Dad took me to my

first Accordion teacher when I was twelve years old. I would walk two miles twice a week, carrying my Accordion. I loved practicing and made quick progress. I was actively competing and won regional as well as the prestigious "Grand Prix of Paris," a national title. I continued my instrument(s) and musical studies and went on to graduate from the Anzaghi Conservatory of Music in Milan.

I came to the United States in 1959, first to Philadelphia and then to Peekskill. I continued my musical studies in theory and composition privately and at Columbia University under Professor Robert Pace. I continued competing and won the US title and the World Cup in the finals held at Carnegie Hall. My concerts took me back to Italy, France, Germany and England.

After arriving in Peekskill, living with my parents, I started attending our beautiful Assumption Church. I remember how much I enjoyed the music! It never occurred to me that one day I would be playing that magnificent pipe organ and that I would be married to Mary Mancini, who was the soloist!

Mary and I have experienced God's blessings and miracles many times over. We are both grateful for our gifts of music and that we have the opportunity to share them not only with our Assumption parish family, but across the US, Europe and China. We both agree that we are so grateful to be able to bring our worldly experiences to our music ministry at Assumption and to also bring that ministry out into the world as well.

God has blessed us with three wonderful children and eight beautiful grandchildren.

Whether I'm playing my accordion or the pipe organ, I always feel a special closeness and thankfulness to God for the special gift of music He has given me.

And I pray that I will continue to make music for a long time to come.
