Seventh Sunday of Easter
 The Music of Longing and Hope
 May 28, 2017

The Music of the Spirit Pentecost Sunday

If there is one song the Holy Spirit sings, it is in UNISON, but paradoxically, that unity manifests itself neither in a dull monotone nor in uniformity, but in HARMONY.

The First Reading for the Vigil of Pentecost is from Genesis - the account of the building of the city which became known as Babel (Babylon) and its - now 'infamous'-tower. "The whole world spoke the SAME language. The Lord came down to see the city and the tower, (and this) one people, all speaking the same language." In a veiled reference to the Trinity, God deliberates with Himself, saying, "Let US go down there and CONFUSE their language... (otherwise) nothing later will stop them from doing whatever they presume to do."

Cities, even now, are often viewed by those who go out and live closer to nature, as unsavory, even godless enclaves which enable evil elements to congregate easily and organize crime. High places, even towers, were built as centers of worship, and in most cases, worship of the stars or pagan deities.

In the First Reading for Pentecost Sunday, the disciples of Jesus are sequestered in Jerusalem, praying and awaiting the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, preparing for their mission to baptize, teach and "make disciples of all nations." It is Pentecost, the fiftieth day since Passover, and this HOLY city is packed with "devout Jews from every nation under Heaven", consequently, speaking in diverse languages. Accompanied by a mighty wind, the Spirit appears in "tongues as of fire" - 'tongues', the same word as 'languages'. In 'fiery speech', Peter and the apostles excitedly address the diverse crowd which becomes amazed, astounded and CONFUSED because they hear the message in their own languages! Paradoxically, the Spirit of the Lord comes down into this city, bringing not confusion, but unity and harmony, and as the Gospel relates, also peace and the power to reconcile through the forgiveness of sins.

ONE SPIRIT, ONE CHURCH # 417 unites the work of five minds spanning ten centuries! The verses derive from Fr. Louis Lambillotte's 19th c. work, "Come, Holy Ghost" which is based on the 9th c. chant, "Veni, Creator Spiritus by Rabanus Maurus, translated by Rev. Edward Caswall. In 1990, the lyrics for the refrain were composed by Sr. Maryanne Quinlivan and set to music by Kevin Keil. It will be sung at the Choir Mass next week.

Human Life Exalted



Jesus prayed on the night before he died, "Father, give me the glory I had with you before the world began." How is the glory he has in the Ascension different from the glory he had "before the world began?" It differs only in that now, he has it in a human nature.

Our humanity has been taken to the heights of heaven, fulfilling the destiny God intended for human life from the beginning. Revelation 3:21 declares, "To the one who gains the victory, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne." God's plan for us is not just that we will gather around the throne or fall down before the throne, but that we will sit with him on the throne! This hope extended to the human family by the Gospel is directly contradicted when the same human beings destined for the heights of heaven are attacked by violence, degraded in their dignity, or put to death by things like abortion. The human nature Jesus brings to glory in the Ascension is the same human nature you and I share, and the same human nature that the babies in the womb share. Celebrating the Ascension in daily life means treating each human life as one destined to sit with Christ on his throne.

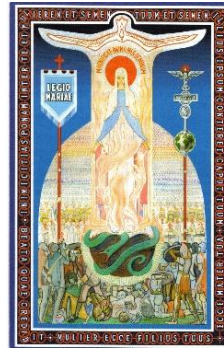

EVERY MEMBER IS A MINISTER: THE GROUPS OF ASSUMPTION SERIES

For the last many weeks, our bulletin has featured a "Behind the Scenes" series so parishioner can know a little more about the many people who work, seen and unseen, to make our parish run smoothly. Starting this week, we begin a new series in which we will focus on a different parish group each week. If it's true that at a successful parish, every member is a minister, it is well that parishioners get to know groups in which they can belong and serve. Assumption is blessed by many groups, devotions and ministries. This week we focus on the Legion of Mary:



The Legion of Mary, is devoted to Our Blessed Mother. It is the largest Apostolic Organization of Lay People in the Catholic Church and has over 3 million active members in almost every country of the world. At Assumption, our English speaking "presidium" is under the patronage of *Our Lady Cause of Our Joy*. And the current President is Lucy Aguiar.

The main purpose of the Legion of Mary is to give glory to God through the sanctification of its members and for this the Legion works with Mary to bring Her

to people's hearts so that they can know Jesus and that is what Mary does perfectly, as She brings people to know Her Son and prays for that with the Holy Spirit.

At present, our group consists of 11 Active Members out of which 7 are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. This extra special spiritual grace gives us the opportunity to carry the Holy Eucharist to homebound parishioners.

We also carry the Holy Eucharist to a couple of Nursing Homes and Hospital to those who are spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament and we pray the Holy Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet on weekly basis at Nursing Homes where we have most of our sick and aged parishioners admitted. We pray with those that are sick or if they are bed-ridden on an individual basis and listen patiently to their woes and if necessary, motivate them in coming back to the Sacraments if they are fallen away Catholics. If such situation arises, we inform our Priests accordingly and they do the needful.

We do home visits with the Statue of Our Lady of Fatima upon request and pray the Rosary with the household members. We attend wakes and funerals in pairs or more and pray the Holy Rosary, we do Book Barrows in a public place or at a church festival which is of immense value as Legionary work, in order to get crowd contacts; we display an abundant supply of inexpensive religious publications, rosaries and other religious items.

Also, the Legion of Mary groups throughout Westchester County have a rank called the Curia which stands above all the Legion of Mary Groups and is responsible for our works as we meet every 3rd Sunday of the month, just the Officers of the Legion, that is, the President and the Vice President where we begin the meeting with a Rosary and follow the Curia Agenda.

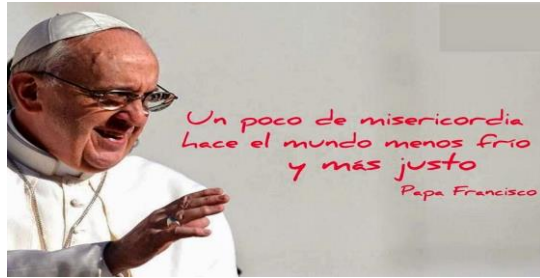
Towards the end, each Legion Group has to provide an Annual Report to the Curia once a year stating all the above various types of works done by them.

Our group meets every week on Wednesdays at 7.15pm at the Rectory where we set up a little altar with Our Blessed Mother, recite the Holy Rosary, follow the prayer format from the Legionary Handbook, report the works done in pairs from the previous week.

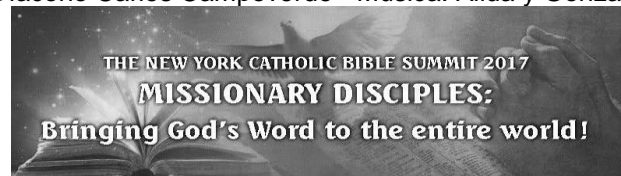
