RESPECT LIFE

Pope Benedict's Encyclical "God is Love"

Pope Benedict XVI says the following words in his encyclical letter "God is Love": "In sacramental communion I become one with the Lord, like all the other communicants. As Saint Paul says, "Because there is one bread, we

who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Cor 10:17). Union with Christ is also union with all those to whom he gives himself. I cannot possess Christ just for myself; I can belong to him only in union with all those who have become, or who will become, his own. ... Love of God and love of neighbour are now truly united: God incarnate draws us all to himself. ... Here the usual contraposition between worship and ethics simply falls apart. "Worship" itself, Eucharistic communion, includes the reality both of being loved and of loving others in turn. A Eucharist which does not pass over into the concrete practice of love is intrinsically fragmented" (n. 14). LENT: THE FASTING AND ABSTINENCE RULES

LENT
 Pray + Fast + Give

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. ALL Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent. As explained in by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, fasting means partaking of only one full meal that day; two other smaller meals may be taken during the day to maintain physical strength, but these mini meals together should not equal a full meal in quantity. Abstinence forbids the consumption of meat but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

THE ALL-ENCOMPASSING PENITENTIAL SPIRIT

The penitential spirit of Lent is both personal and communal. On an individual level, each person must choose how he or she will show forth this spirit of penance. On a communal level, we join as a Church and a parish to show sorrow for our sins and the sins of the whole world. At the end of Mass and Liturgy of the Word services on Ash Wednesday, everyone will receive a small purple square of cloth to be worn throughout Lent as a sign of our efforts to repent and make reparation to God.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS



The book of psalms is one of the most important books of the Bible. Quoted in the New Testament more than any other book, they show us how well the gospel writers knew them. Our Lord Jesus often used psalms to explain his teachings and strengthen the faith of his people. They express the yearnings of the heart, giving us hope and courage in times of struggle and drawing us into a deeply personal encounter with God.

Join Jeff Cavins, Sarah Christmyer, and Dr. Tim Gray as they show us the historical significance of the Psalms, the different kinds of worship they embody, and how, through them, we can have an intimate dialogue with God.

Small group discussions will be led by dedicated facilitators. Coffee and tea will be provided. The \$40 fee includes a study guide and access to DVDs.


